

Three minutes, eight seconds!

Lima: Gabriel Barbosa, who scored two goals in the last three minutes before being sent off as Flamengo won the Copa Libertadores for the first time since 1981, is one of the most controversial footballers in Brazil. In a nation that loves a footballing rebel, Barbosa ticks all the modern boxes, with his tattoos, media-grabbing stunts, frequent disciplinary problems and, most importantly of all, his goals.

He instantly secured legendary status among Flamengo fans on Saturday with his brace of goals in the dying seconds that gave his club an astonishing 2-1 win over defending champions River Plate in Lima.

No one could say that the goals — or the sending off, his second in two successive games and which followed confusing scenes after River Plate's Exequiel Palacios was shown a red card in the dying seconds of the game — were entirely unexpected.

The 23-year-old striker joined Flamengo in January on loan from Inter Milan and has been one of the reasons the Rio side are now just a step away from becoming only

the second Brazilian team — and the first since Pele's Santos in 1963 — to do a Libertadores and league double. He is the top goalscorer in both tournaments and fully deserving of his nickname Gabigol — Gabi being short for Gabriel and Gol meaning Goal in Portuguese. However, he is almost as well known for his persona, which he himself described as "marrento", which translates as stubborn, uncompromising and cocky.

Barbosa, who is the boyfriend of Neymar's sister, hit the headlines with Santos in 2014 when, as a teen, he ended his first season as top goalscorer and then helped them win the Paulista state championship the following season. That clinched him a transfer to Inter but he was loaned to Benfica and then Santos. REUTERS

London: Pep Guardiola has built his decade of soccer success on creating teams that dominate possession and on Saturday — for the first time in his career — one of his teams had less of the ball than the opposition.

From Barcelona to Bayern Munich and on to Manchester City, the 'Pep way' has been built around an obsessive attention to keeping hold of the ball. But on Saturday, something strange happened - his City side beat Chelsea in the Premier League without having a majority of the possession.

The possession stat of 46.74 during City's 2-1 win was the lowest recorded by a side managed by Guardiola in any of his 381 top-flight matches in charge at his three clubs. "There is always one thing in your lifetime that hasn't happened. It happened," he said.

"So, OK, I have another record. I won one game without possession. They (Chelsea) are an incredible team with Kante, Kovacic, Jorgin-

ho, so it can happen," he said. Chelsea's midfield was indeed impressive but Guardiola teams have regularly played against top-quality mid-fields and still dominated the ball. Guardiola credited Chelsea's performance on the "courage" of their manager Frank Lampard. "They are so good, they are an incredible team. It's Chelsea. Football is becoming like this. Most teams and young managers have spirit and nothing to lose," he said. "I wanted to come here and be brave on the ball, be brave off the ball," Lampard said.

Midfielder Kevin De Bruyne, whose goal brought City back on level terms after N'Golo Kante's opener before Riyad Mahrez's 37th-minute match-winner, said the game showed there was another way of winning. "People expect us to have 70 percent possession but these guys have a lot of quality," said the Belgian. "It shows our other side - we can control the game while defending." REUTERS

Welshman Boored During Real's 3-1 Win Over Sociedad

Madrid: Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane asked supporters to start backing Gareth Bale and move on from the club versus country row which led to the Wales forward being treated to a cacophony of boos in his side's 3-1 win over Real Sociedad on Saturday.

The 100 million euro (\$110.22 million) bench was boored when he came off the bench in the second half of the Liga game against Sociedad at the Santiago Bernabeu. "There is too much noise with Bale, he wants to be here and do as well as he can, that's why we don't want to talk too much about this. He is integrated into the group and he wants to play well, just like everyone else," Zidane said.

"I hope this doesn't continue throughout the season. We want the fans to be with us from the start of the game to the end but we can't control this."

'ISL has helped Indian players'

Hyderabad: Hyderabad FC goalkeeper Kamaljit Singh is an ace shot-stopper with excellent leadership skills. The 23-year old Indian goalkeeper is the captain of the team. A product of the AIFF academy in Goa, Kamaljit started off as a central defender before switching positions. Singh had a breakthrough season after he signed for FC Pune City in 2017 and moved to Hyderabad FC in 2019.

How did you make the transition from defender to goalkeeper?

When I was selected to the academy as an 11-year-old, I did not know much about football. During the academy trials, despite not being a goalkeeper, I gave the trial and played well. I was trained in goal-keeping and improved a lot in the following year. Later, I represented the country.

Having gone through all the stages in the Indian system, what do you make of Indian football?

Indian football team has made a lot of progress in the last 10 years. Indian Super League (ISL) has helped develop Indian footballers. There is work being done at the grassroots level to develop young players, which did not happen in the past. Our FIFA rank was around 160, but now we are near the 100 range. It will take time to improve.

The team lost due to a penalty in the last match. As captain, how do you deal with team morale?

All of our players were not fit at the start of the season. Bobo and Rafa have recovered now. Nestor Gordillo will join the squad in December. The coach has created a positive atmosphere and the team will definitely give their all in the upcoming matches.

Do you think the team can make the top 4 and the playoff stage?

We can definitely make top four and qualify for the playoffs. The team is yet to play 14 matches, which means 42 points in-hand. We have 3 points and teams with at least 30 points have qualified for playoffs in previous seasons. If we can get 27 of the 42 points available, I am sure we will make top 4.

What has been the impact of the coach Phil Brown?

Brown has in-depth insights of every player. There is mutual respect between the player and the manager. In some teams, I have seen players come under pressure but that is not the case at this club.

CFC & Gregory desperate for a turnaround in fortunes

Chennai: A couple of weeks after indicating his possible resignation as Chennaiyin coach, John Gregory was back in the hot seat on Sunday as he addressed the media on the eve of their crucial home game against Hyderabad. Gregory's comments — stating that it may be time for someone else to take over — had come in the immediate aftermath of their 0-3 defeat against Bengaluru on November 10, but the Englishman has now suggested that his reaction came in the spur of the moment. Having had the international break to ponder over his future, Gregory seems up for the challenge of reviving their fortunes.

Chennaiyin are currently placed at the bottom of the ISL table, having racked up just one point from four games. Their profligacy up front — underlined by the fact that they are yet to score this season — has been at the heart of their struggles. "I was shell-shocked after our performance against Bengaluru. We

had a lot of chances in our two matches at home against Mumbai City and ATK without managing to score. Going into the Bengaluru game, I was relaxed and confident that we will get a good result. But the way we lost hurt me more than anything. But we have picked each other up since then and got back to work. We are extremely determined to get six points from our next two games at home, which will put us right back in the race," Gregory said.

Asked whether he will definitely stay on for the rest of the season, the Englishman said that

the nature of the job is such that it comes with no guarantees. "All I am focusing on is the game on Monday. I talk to the owners on a regular basis, but nothing special has been said. Since we returned from the loss to Bengaluru, we have just focused on the game against Hyderabad," he added.

While Chennaiyin have been abject so far, Hyderabad FC have only fared marginally better. The new side is situated at ninth in the table with just one win from four games. They have been plagued by injuries to key players, but coach Phil Brown is relieved that most of the players are back. India defender Adil Khan, however, will be missing from action after suffering an injury during the World Cup qualifier against Oman. "The biggest challenge for all of us was in the treatment room. We had nine players who were injured. Around five-six of them would have been starters in my team at the start of the season. That lack of quality on the pitch was probably why we have won just one game. But our injury concerns have eased," he said.
