Nets end road trip with win over LA Clippers

Los Angeles: James Harden finished with 37 points and 11 rebounds as the Brooklyn Nets improved to 7-0 against Pacific Division teams this season with a 112-108 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers on Sunday. The Nets went a perfect 5-0 on their western swing road trip and extended their win streak to a season-high six games. Harden recorded the 77th career double-double and added seven assists at Staples Center arena in southern California.

Singapore: India's Ramkumar Ramanathan bowed out of the Singapore Open after a close three-straight defeat to American Taro Daniel in the opening round, here on Monday. Ramkumar, ranked 200, lost 3-6, 7-6(3), 3-6 in two hours and six minutes to the American, who is ranked 80 places above him. Ramkumar had two chances to break his opponent's serve in the match but could not convert any of them. It was the second defeat for Ramkumar against Daniel.

Osaka climbs to second spot

Paris: Naomi Osaka moved up one spot to second in the WTA rankings released on Monday following her success at the Australian Open, as she won her fourth Grand Slam title. The Japanese star beat Jennifer Brady of the US in straight sets in the final to lift the trophy in Melbourne for the second time in three years.

New Delhi: The fear of the coronavirus has made way for a fierce desire to compete in star Indian boxer M C Mary Kom's mind as she gears up for her first tournament in a year next week, having recovered from the muscle loss triggered by a recent bout of dengue. The 37-year-old six-time world champion mostly trained at home in 2020 and joined the national camp in Bengaluru for a fortnight last month after recovering from dengue. "I was scared (of travelling) and I will still be very cautious and concerned but then how long can you go on fearing? The cycle has to stop at some point," she said.

Women boxers win five gold

New Delhi: Babyrjisana Changu (51kg) and Arundhati Choudhary (69kg) fetched two more gold medals as Indian women boxers ended with five overall for a top finish in the 30th Adriatic Pearl Tournament in Budva, Montenegro. Lucky Rana (64kg) secured a silver as Indian women emerged as the top team with 10 medals (five gold, three silver and two bronze). Uzbekistan (2 gold) and Czech Republic (1 gold) ended at second and third position respectively. Alfia Pathan (+81kg), Vinka (60kg) and T Sanamacha Chanu (75kg) are the other Indian women boxers who secured gold medals.

Vijender set to return to ring

New Delhi: Unbeaten Indian professional boxing star Vijender Singh will be back in action next month after more than a year long hiatus forced by Covid-19, his promoters announced on Monday. The fight will take place in India but the venue will be revealed later. "While the promoters finalise on the opponent, date and venue, Vijender Singh will certainly be in action this March with an aim to extend his unbeaten streak 12-0 (8 knockout wins) in professional boxing," his promoters IOS Boxing Promotions said. 10-MAN HYDERABAD FC HOLD MOHUN BAGAN

Nizams Stay Fourth After Exciting Draw

The Nizams held on to draw 2-2 against league leaders ATK Mohun Bagan despite going down to 10 men at the Tilak Maidan Stadium on Monday.

Aridane Santana drew first blood for Hyderabad when he scored at the eighth minute. Manvir Singh equalized for the Mariners at the hour mark but substitute Roland Alberg put the Nizams ahead in the 75th minute.

Pritam Kotal cancelled out Alberg's goal when he capitalized on an error by the Hyderabad keeper and scored in extra time to ensure both sides shared a point each in the key clash.

Hyderabad suffered an early blow when defender Chinglensana Singh was sent off after he brought down David Williams, who was clear on goal, near the 18-yard box.

But Aridane responded for the Nizams just three minutes when he nudged the ball past ATKMB keeper Arindam Bhattacharya after a mix-up between Pritam and

Tiri. Shortly after, Roy Krishna had his first crack on goal when he headed the ball just wide of the goalpost from a corner. A perennial threat, the Fijian nearly equalized for ATKMB after he received the ball near the penalty box, but lost it to Joao Victor.

Hyderabad held on despite

multiple attempts by the Mariners to make their one-man advantage count. Goalkeeper Laxmikant Kattimani came out of his box to deny Williams, who was sprinting through on goal. Minutes later, Odeh Naainida stepped up when he got a foot to a ball from Krishna, preventing Williams from making

it 1-1.

Liston Colaco fumbled a chance to double Hyderabad's lead just before half-time when he received a ball near the touch-line, went on a solo run and could only deliver a tame shot straight at Bhattacharya, despite Halicharan Narzary standing unmarked near the penalty box.

ATKMB introduced Jayesh Rane at the start of the second-half, seeking to shore up their attack. The strategic change paid off when Williams was laid in the middle of the field and ball it on for Manvir, who whipped a quick strike past Kattimani from a narrow angle at the hour mark.

Substitute Alberg handed the Nizams the lead just before the water break when he pounced on a ball from Aridane and struck a stunner past Bhattacharya, who could only dive in vain.

The Mariners stepped up their offensive efforts in the final minutes in the search for an equalizer. Rane sent a cross inside the box and Pritam secured a point for ATKMB in injury time, depositing the ball inside the net after Kattimani spilled it. The draw meant that ATK Mohun Bagan was left waiting for the League Winners Shield while Hyderabad remained at the fourth spot in the table.

Hyderabad: City lad SFR Snehit knocked out defending champion Harmeet Desai 11-9, 11-7, 11-9, 11-5 and sixth seed Sushit Sriram 8-11, 12-10, 11-9, 11-8, 11-3 in the quarterfinals of the UTT 82nd National table tennis championships in Panjkula on Monday. The 20-year-old from Telangana showed speed and power in the quarterfinals. Down 0-1, he was looking for a turning point after managing to deuce. The umpire reversed a wrong call to award the point to Snehit that put him 11-10 up. Snehit never looked back.

Troubled with Sushmit's rare combination of rubbers — one side anti and the other, pimple — Snehit began in a measured way before slowing down the game to shift gears. Sushmit, who loves the ball coming to him, was not prepared as Snehit used the flanks to unsettle his rival. Attacking and using the backhand blocks with equal felicity, Snehit took a comfortable 3-1 lead and soon closed out the match. Snehit is set to end the long drought of a medal in the Nationals.
